Lond. lib. 4. cap. 8 sect. 32.) A. {ounce} ij Tartar Vitriolate, Elaterium, A. {ounce} jss: Extract of Saffron, Pouder of Cloves, Mace, Nutmegs, Castoreum A. {ounce} j: Oyl of Rosemary, or of Cloves {ounce} ss: mix them; and with Syrupus de spina Cervina q.s. make a mass of Pills. The posthumous 1724 edition of Quincy's Dispensatory also includes (p469) a recipe for the 'Family Pill': 'These we give in compliance to such who have been brought into an opinion of them by the commendation given them by their pretended author Salmon. They make a good purge enough in many chronic cases and work with briskness'. (Cf. p.335 for Gutta Vitae 'the medicine which Salmon made so much noise with. It is an excellent medicine in proper hands'.)
